

Andrea Rosati was born in Terni (Italy) on October 2nd, 1964. He graduated in Animal Science at the Faculty of Agriculture of Perugia and later obtained a Master of Science and then the Philosophy Doctor at the University of Nebraska - Lincoln (USA). Between 1994 and 2001 he had been the Head of Technical and Scientific Division of the Italian Animal Breeders Association (AIA), based in Rome (Italy). He had been, from 2002 to 2004, the General Manager of the largest Italian DNA laboratory for animals (Laboratorio di Genetica e Servizi - LGS). Then he moved to Rome where he has been, from 2002 till now, the Secretary General of the *European Federation of Animal Science* (EAAP) and the Secretary General of the *World Association of Animal Production* (WAAP). He had also been, from 2003 till 2014, the Secretary General of the *International Committee for Animal Recording* (ICAR) that is the world association setting up standards for animal breeding. He is a member of the High Committee for Agricultural Research at the European Community. He was coordinator of five EU supported projects and in charge of other duties for other eight projects. He had been University Professor at the University of Bologna (Italy) and at the University of Camerino (Italy) for courses about statistics and genetic improvement. He has been co-founder and member of the board of directors of two international scientific journals. He was involved in genetic engineering in animals, dissemination of scientific application of advanced technologies in livestock, planning of strategic projects for improving efficiency in animal husbandry, and more generally in agriculture. He has taught courses, conferences and lectures in more than 35 countries.
